

Title I – Letter to Parents About Highly Qualified Teachers

Dear Families:

This letter explains the federal law that requires teachers to be, or become, highly qualified in the subjects they teach. That law, called the *Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)*, has been designed to help your child achieve more in school.

The law states that all teachers who teach in core content areas must meet a specific legal definition of "highly qualified" in order to teach in schools that receive Title I funding. Our school receives Title I funds, which supplement the programs in the school. The legal definition of a "highly qualified teacher" has three parts. It states that teachers must have the following:

- 1. A fouryear college degree
- 2. A standard teaching certificate
- 3. Proof of their knowledge in the subjects they teach

The law also requires us to notify parents if their child is being taught for four (4) or more weeks by a teacher in a Title I school or program who does not yet meet the federal definition of highly qualified. Our district has a practice that we do not interview applicants unless they are highly qualified.

All of our teachers are highly qualified for their positions. This letter also informs you, as Title I families, that you have the right to request the qualifications of your child's teacher.

Your child's teacher is dedicated to the success of every child in the class. I encourage you to continue to support your child's education and communicate with the teacher on a regular basis. Through our partnership, we can provide your child with the best education possible.
